I. Welcome and Introductions

- D. Williams welcomed the committee, staff and attendees.
- A quorum was established with five (5) voting members.
- D. Williams thanked ELC staff for participating in the event in Miami Gardens.

II. Approval of Agenda

- S. Fagundo moved to approve the agenda.
- R. Beasley seconded the motion.
- Motion was unanimously passed.

III. Approval of August 31st Minutes

- R. Beasley moved to approve the August 31st minutes.
- A. K. Weller seconded the motion.
- Motion was unanimously passed.

IV. CEO Update

- A video of an investigative report by CBS 4 regarding childcare centers with DCF licensing violations was presented.
- E. Torres discussed the draft policy that will be presented to the full board discussing disallowing School Readiness (SR) funding for providers with childcare licensing Class 1 and 2 violations on record.
 - One of the proposals states that the ELC would no longer conduct business with providers that have Class 1 and 2 violations.
 - The other proposal would require all childcare providers doing business with the ELC to obtain a license as per Florida Administrative Code 65C-



22 which contains a provision for licensing of school age childcare providers.

- We will reevaluate the process for how we contract with childcare providers that serve SR children and ensure that all childcare providers are doing business under the standards of licensing.
 - One of the concerns of the Provider Services Committee was regarding having a dual system as a result of implementing this policy that would penalize licensed providers with Class 1 and 2 violations. Unlicensed providers could also have the same violations but there would be no licensing body to monitor them.
 - Another recommendation is to create an exception for MDCPS since they have their own Department of Education (DOE) sanctioned requirements.
 - This policy would only apply to Miami-Dade providers. The Monroe County Advisory Committee will provide advice to the board regarding policies that affect Monroe County.
- S. Fagundo asked for clarification of which categories of providers, other than MDCPS, would be exempt from licensure under this policy.
 - E. Torres stated that we are still waiting on clarification of the religious exempt category.
 - J. Russell clarified that informal providers would be exempt.
 - E. Torres added that this policy was created at the request of licensed childcare providers who have expressed their concern over the last few years.
 - D. Williams asked why the school system would be considered exempt.
 - E. Torres clarified that the school system is governed by the DOE whose standards satisfy the background check stipulation, as well as other standards.
 - S. Fagundo asked for clarification of the public school exemption being for providers operating at or by MDCPS.
 - E. Torres clarified that only programs operated by MDCPS would be exempt.
 - R. Beasley suggested further clarification of the wording prior to submitting it to the board.
 - D. Williams stated he would not support the draft policy if the wording included "programs."
 - S. Fagundo stated that she supported changing the wording of the draft policy as long as the intent does not change.
 - E. Torres stated that an amendment would be made and then submitted to the committee chair.
 - R. Beasley asked if there was consensus on this policy by providers.
 - S. Fagundo stated that she did have the discussion and did not experience any pushback from providers.
 - L. Carmona stated that many of the licensed childcare providers support the policy because of the two parallels that exist. Currently, unlicensed childcare providers do not have to meet the same criteria nor incur the same expenses for licensing as licensed providers but still receive the same reimbursement. Overwhelmingly, the policy will have support from licensed childcare providers since it does help to level the playing field.
 - In response to D. Williams request for a timeline for implementation, E. Torres responded that staff recommends that July 1, 2011 would be the effective date in order to give both the providers and the ELC time to prepare.
 - S. Fagundo suggested looking at the violations in the interim in order to preemptively identify which violations might be contested in the grievance process. There are cases in which the provider might call the fire inspector for a fire inspection to be done and no one comes. The provider would then be cited with a violation, at no fault of theirs.



- E. Torres stated that this is a great suggestion. The intent is not to suspend a provider for a minor violation so the first step would be to send a letter of intent so that the Provider Services Committee gets an opportunity to assess the situation.
- R. Beasley moved to have the Program and Strategy Committee support the recommendation of the Provider Services Committee with the changed presented here today.
 - A. K. Weller seconded the motion.
 - Motion unanimously passed.

V. School Age Provider Repayments

- J. Russell stated that the ELC identified some providers who have indicated they were school age providers (child enrichment, afterschool, etc.) who were serving children younger than five. By law they are not allowed to serve these children. We will need to take back payments from those providers. We will send a letter to the providers advising them of this and parents will be contacted so that they have the opportunity to find an alternate provider.
- S. Fagundo asked how these providers can operate without a license, defraud the program and not incur a penalty.
- J. Colyer responded that there is a penalty and these individuals are fined for operating without a license. They are in jeopardy of not being able to receive a license for an extended period of time.
- E. Torres added that perhaps we should explore this as a policy to address providers that may be illegally operating without a license.

VI. Child Enrichment Providers

- J. Russell discussed whether child enrichment providers should be paid with SR funding.
 - Chapter 402 of the licensing regulations define the intent of child enrichment providers as those individuals who go into licensed centers and add an enrichment activity. In Miami-Dade County enrichment providers have sprung up and are operating independent locations. That was never the intent of that program. We need to decide whether or not to continue to contract with these providers.
- E. Torres stated that a discussion took place in Palm Beach and they discovered that this is an issue in a number of other parts of the state as well. The unintended consequence is that there is a set of providers receiving the same reimbursement rate but are operating without a license or standards. However, if you ask a parent of any of the children participating in one of these programs, they will share with you the value of these programs to their children. The assistance that some of these programs provide these children with homework, from a parent's perspective, is of high value and should not be discontinued.

VII. New Providers

- J. Russell stated that since there is so much discussion on types of providers, license status, and the age groups of children served, the staff is requesting a recommendation to have a moratorium put on any new providers in the SR program until these issues are resolved. There is not currently a problem with capacity.



- D. Williams asked what is holding up the making of decisions relevant to these issues.
- E. Torres stated that part of this matter has been turned over to strategic planning. We would like to go to the community for feedback and have the board set priorities with the feedback in mind. Listening sessions are scheduled in order to facilitate these discussions.
- J. Russell stated that purpose for the request for a moratorium on new providers is to avoid taking on new providers only to find out that they might have multiple violations, or do not qualify based on policy. It is better to wait until the providers currently in the program are addressed, prior to bringing anyone new in.
- S. Fagundo moved to accept staff's recommendation to have a moratorium on new providers put in place.
 - R. Beasley seconded the motion.
 - Motion was unanimously passed.

VIII. Mail in Redetermination

- E. Humes-Newbold discussed the mail-in redetermination process.
 - The process has been in place since January of 2007.
 - According to the rules, redetermination must take place every six months.
 - In order to be more efficient, the parents are not required to come in for a face-to-face interview.
 - Parents are to receive their packets 45 days prior to their last day of service. However, parents know what their last day of service is six months in advance. If they do not receive their packet by mail, they need to know to contact Child Development Services in order for them to complete the packet and return it.
 - What is happening is that there are a lot of parents coming in person to the redetermination until wanting staff to review their packets. It is slowing down the process.
 - Starting November 1st, parents can mail the packet in, or drop it in the box at the M.L.K. building and CDS staff will process it. Staff will not be available to answer questions. If additional information is required, staff will contact the parent.
 - Since many providers now have access to the internet, they can check the statuses of their clients online 24 hours a day, seven days a week. In addition, providers receive a separate notice in the mail listing children whose services will be terminated that month.
- D. Williams asked if CDS staff could attend the listening sessions in order to answer providers' questions. E. Humes-Newbold agreed to have staff in attendance.

X. Adjourn

- D. Williams adjourned the meeting.

SCHOOL READINESS FUNDED PROVIDER LICENSE POLICY

PURPOSE: To establish a standardized policy statement requiring licenses for providers in Miami-Dade County who participate in the School Readiness program and receive funding from the Early Learning Coalition of Miami-Dade/Monroe (the “Coalition”).

POLICY STATEMENT: With an effective date of July 1, 2011, this policy statement sets the policy in Miami-Dade County for Providers applying to contract with the Coalition to provide School Readiness funded services. All Providers must be licensed by the Department of Children & Families (“DCF”) in order to be eligible to enter into School Readiness contracts with the Coalition, except for: (i) Religiously-exempt faith-based organizations under ss. 402.316, F.S. (“Religiously-Exempt, Faith-Based Organizations”); (ii) Miami-Dade County School System programs, provided the programs are operated and staffed directly by the schools and meet all other requirements under ss. 402.3025, F.S. (“Miami-Dade County School System Programs”); and (iii) Informal providers, defined as unregulated child care arranged by the child’s parent, either in the child’s home or elsewhere, provided by relatives, friends, or neighbors (“Informal Providers”). Providers must satisfy eligibility requirements as set forth in the Provider Agreement for School Readiness Funded Services.

RATIONALE: To ensure a system of accountability for the health and safety of children and the accountability and management of tax payer funded services.

PROCEDURES: Effective July 1, 2011, the Coalition will accept School Readiness Provider Agreement contracts only from providers who are licensed by DCF. This requirement applies to after-school programs and school-age programs that are not operated and staffed directly by the school system; child enrichment providers; and summer camps. This requirement shall not apply to (i) Religiously-Exempt Faith-Based Organizations; (ii) Miami-Dade County School System Programs; and (iii) Informal Providers..

Unlicensed providers submitting a contract will have the contract returned to them unprocessed and notified in writing of the Coalition’s decision. The provider will also receive notice of the right to appeal the decision. Appeals will be governed by the Coalition’s Grievance Policy. If the Provider fails to appeal the action within 30 business days from receiving written notification of the Coalition’s actions, the action becomes final.

Once the provider receives a valid license from DCF, it is eligible to reapply to provide School Readiness Funded Services. Coalition funds will not be used to reimburse any unlicensed provider who is not exempt pursuant to the terms set forth in this Policy Statement. Non-exempt unlicensed providers serving children do so at their own risk and expense.

A licensed provider whose license is revoked, suspended, or otherwise rendered invalid will not receive reimbursement for any period of time during which its license was revoked, suspended, or otherwise rendered invalid.

Parents of children enrolled with non-exempt unlicensed providers will be notified that the provider is not approved to provide school readiness services and will be given Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) assistance to locate an approved provider. Any parent who wishes to maintain their child in the identified program may continue with the unlicensed program at their own expense and without benefit of funding from the Coalition.

CHILD SAFETY LICENSING POLICY STATEMENT

PURPOSE: To establish a standardized policy statement for administrative sanctions against School Readiness providers in Miami-Dade County who have action taken against their license or approval status as provided herein.

POLICY STATEMENT: With an effective date of July 1, 2011, this policy statement sets the process in Miami-Dade County when Providers are the subject of disciplinary action against their license, registration or approval status for failure to maintain acceptable standards to operate a School Readiness funded program in violation of applicable rules and obligations.

RATIONALE: To ensure a system of accountability for the health and safety of children.

PROCEDURES:

The Department of Children and Families (DCF) has the authority, pursuant to Chapter 402.302-319, F.S. and 65C-22, F.A.C., to take progressive disciplinary measures against any licensed or registered child care provider who fails to maintain licensing standards which meet the health and safety needs of children.

Equivalent overseeing entities of child care programs exempt from licensure pursuant to sections 402.316 or 402.3025 F.S., are responsible for ensuring compliance with the health and safety standards set forth in ss. 402.302-319 F.S. and 65C-22, F.A.C., with the exception of 65C-22.001(1) and (2)(a), FAC, and may impose disciplinary actions for child care programs under their auspices.

Where the provider has no equivalent overseeing entity and is funded by the Coalition, the Coalition shall ensure compliance with the health and safety standards of Chapter 402.302-319 F.S. and Rule 65C-20, FAC, and may impose similar disciplinary actions for child care programs under its auspices.

In the event DCF, the Coalition, or an equivalent overseeing entity, initiates action against a program's license or determines that the program has received one (1) Class I licensing violation* or two (2) Class II licensing violations** during any consecutive 12 month period (or determines that there has been a health and safety violation for license exempt and unlicensed programs), the Coalition will promptly take the following actions which shall be applied prospectively and retroactively to July 1, 2010:

- a. Place a moratorium on new enrollments of School Readiness children for 12 months if Final Agency action is taken adverse to the Provider; and
- b. Notify the Provider, in writing, that all funding will cease if Final Agency Action is taken adverse to the Provider. Funding will then cease at the end of thirty (30) business days or when alternate child care arrangements are found for School Readiness children, whichever is sooner; and

- c. Give the Provider written notification of the Coalition's actions and rationale, along with notice of the provider's right of appeal. Appeals shall be governed by the Grievance Policy. If the Board of Directors of the Early Learning Coalition of Miami-Dade/Monroe grants the appeal and finds that the action: (i) Was not based on competent substantial evidence; or (ii) Did not comply with the essential requirements of law, no further action will be taken against the Provider pursuant to the alleged violations; and
- d. If Final Agency Action is taken against the Provider, ensure parents of School Readiness children actively enrolled with the provider are contacted and apprised of the situation. Parents will be given Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) assistance to locate an approved provider; and
- e. If Final Agency Action is taken against the Provider, ensure parents are provided a maximum of thirty (30) business days to locate another approved SR provider if they wish to continue with Coalition funding. Parents will be offered Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R) assistance to locate an approved provider.

Miami-Dade County will update the EFS system to reflect the moratorium for School Readiness child placements.

Any parent who wishes to maintain their child in the identified program, may continue on their own expense and without benefit of funding from the Coalition.

If the Provider fails to appeal the action within 30 business days from receiving written notification of the Coalition's actions, the action becomes final.

The EFS and DCF system will be updated to reflect the child care provider is no longer eligible to provide School Readiness services.

The provider is able to reapply to be a participating School Readiness provider after the 12 month moratorium has expired and the program has cured the health and safety condition to the satisfaction of DCF, the Coalition, or equivalent overseeing entity, or the provider has regained licensure or a satisfactory status with DCF, the Coalition, or its equivalent overseeing entity.

*** Class I Violation:** An incident of noncompliance with a Class I standard. Class I violations are the most serious violations in nature, pose an imminent threat to a child including abuse or neglect, and which could or does result in death or serious harm to the health, safety, or well-being of a child.

**** Class II Violation:** The second or subsequent incident of noncompliance with an individual Class II standard. Class II violations are less serious in nature than Class I violations and could

be anticipated to pose a threat to the health, safety, or well-being of a child, although the threat is not imminent.

The department established these two internal measures through its performance tracking process, which requires each of its programs to establish performance measures and performance targets. The two internal measures assess the timeliness of its inspections of licensed child care facilities and homes. For each month in Fiscal Year 2008-09, the Child Care Program generally met or exceeded its targets for both measures. However, it should be noted that the internal measures do not assess the outcomes of the inspections (whether the facilities are complying with state standards), as does the current legislative measure.

Florida law also directs other state agencies to regulate child care establishments; considerable overlap occurs

Florida law also requires two other state agencies to regulate child care establishments. These agencies are the Agency for Workforce Innovation and the Department of Health. In addition, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation carries out similar regulatory functions to DCF for non-child care-related businesses in Florida.

The Agency for Workforce Innovation. In 2001, the Legislature transferred the responsibility for administering the School Readiness Program (previously called Subsidized Child Care) to the Agency for Workforce Innovation and the early learning coalitions.⁹ However, responsibility for child care licensing, training related to licensure and regulatory compliance, remained with the Department of Children and Families.

Pursuant to Florida law, the Agency for Workforce Innovation administers the School Readiness and Voluntary Prekindergarten Education (VPK) programs and the Child Care Resource and Referral Network.¹⁰ The agency works with 31 local early learning coalitions that provide School Readiness and

⁹ In 1999, the Legislature enacted the School Readiness Act (Ch. [99-357](#), *Laws of Florida*) to create a more efficient and integrated school readiness system, and increase children's chances of achieving future educational success and becoming productive members of society. The act created the Florida Partnership for School Readiness, a state-level governing board to coordinate statewide program efforts and created local School Readiness coalitions to plan and implement a comprehensive program of readiness services. The partnership was assigned to the Executive Office of the Governor for administrative purposes. In 2001, The Legislature transferred administrative support of the partnership from the Executive Office of the Governor to the Agency for Workforce Innovation (Ch. [2001-170](#), *Laws of Florida*). In 2004, the Legislature eliminated the partnership and transferred its responsibilities for early education to the Agency for Workforce Innovation, making the agency responsible for state-level coordination of the School Readiness and VPK programs and of the School Readiness coalitions, renamed as early learning coalitions.
