President's Message



Dear Friends:

At the Early Learning Coalition, children are our greatest priority. We share with you the enormous responsibility of the safety and well-being of the children in our counties. Therefore, I urge you to learn about the dangers of leaving children unattended in vehicles in order to prevent tragic accidents.

The Coalition's Look Before You Lock Campaign strives to educate parents and childcare providers by supplying them with valuable information to keep children safe. On a sunny day with temperatures in the low 80s, it only takes 20 minutes for a car to reach deadly temperatures. Hyperthermia, or higher than normal body temperatures, can cause seizures, organ damage, brain damage, stroke or even death, especially in children.

I urge you to bring these points to light with parents and caregivers. Remind them of the dangers of leaving children alone inside vehicles and of the unintentional consequences it may bring. Help them come up with a routine that includes placing reminders to check the car to make sure they have dropped their children off at school. Ask them to place a purse or briefcase in the backseat to make sure they have to look in the back of the car before leaving. Ensuring their child's safety could be as easy as placing a teddy bear, a toy or the diaper bag on the passenger seat as a reminder that their little one is in the car. Set a plan with parents to call if a child has not arrived as scheduled.

I sincerely thank you for serving as ambassadors for our Look Before You Lock campaign. If you or any of your parents would like more information about the campaign, I highly encourage you to stop by our office to pick up brochures, window decals and other materials to help spread awareness about this child safety initiative. David Lawrence Addresses State Board of Education in Tampa



As David Lawrence, president of The Early Childhood Initiative Foundation, said in his Aug. 2 speech to Florida's Board of Education, the path to genuine education "reform" in Florida and America most wisely begins with the early learning years. The window of learning is open most widely in the years from birth to age 5. Florida's early education system cannot be built in a day or a decade, but we can build better quality care by taking significant steps quickly, prudently and inexpensively.

There are three steps that could be implemented early, realistically and inexpensively to ensure quality care in Florida:

- Require an evidence-based curriculum in every VPK classroom.
- Require pre- and post-assessments for every child in a VPK program.
- Require the state, using those assessments of progress, to tell the people of Florida which programs and which providers are most effective and what the common factors were in their success.

We do some things well in Florida's VPK program. Our state arrived at comprehensive early learning standards, rightly connecting what children will learn throughout their years of schooling. Also, there can be no more than 20 children in a classroom with at least two adults. There are many outstanding programs in Florida, though room for improvement remains. We want to help ensure that Florida's VPK is of the highest quality in order to give our state's children an even better chance to succeed in school and in life. The people of Florida deserve and need to know that their money is being spent on high-quality programs that deliver real outcomes for children.

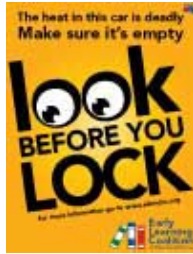

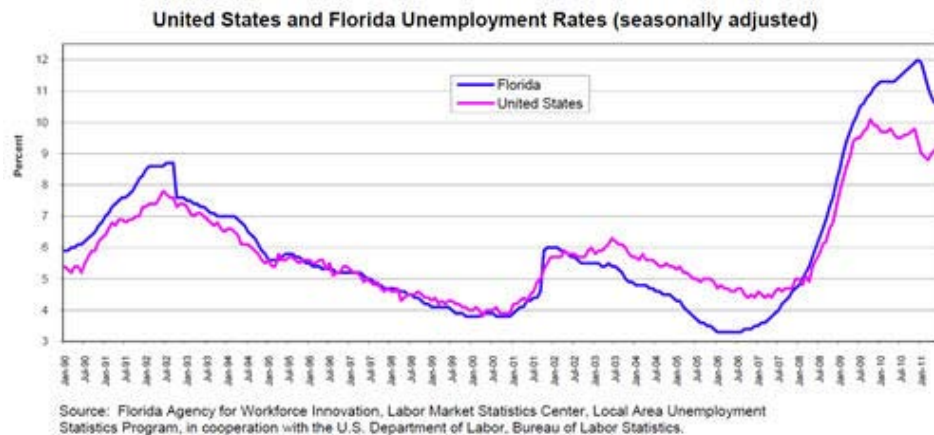

Florida Releases Its Employment Figures for June

For June 2011, Florida's Agency for Workforce Innovation (AWI) reported that the State's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate is 10.6 percent, a rate unchanged since May 2011. Florida has gained 85,500 jobs from January to June 2011.

Florida was recognized by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce last month as the top state for workforce training programs in its "Enterprising States" report.

FCCPC Training Programs Sponsored by Wesley House Family Services
